Saturday, 13 July 2024

A study day exploring the rich material from Rifeh with Bram Calcoen, Wolfram Grajetzki, Campbell Price, Marisol Solchaga, John Tait, and Paul Whelan.

In 1907 Flinders Petrie and his team excavated several burial grounds at Rifeh in Middle Egypt. They uncovered about 450 burials dating to the Middle Kingdom, Second Intermediate Period and New Kingdom. Several thousand objects were found and are now in many collections all around the world. Over the last fifteen years those items have been collected in a UCL project and can now be re-united, at least on paper. Join us for an exclusive preview of the upcoming publication content and hear directly from the authors. After the day of talks, the Petrie Museum will be open for in-person attendees for a private visit to view the rich material from Rifeh.
